Words from the Pastor

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here! – 2 Corinthians 5:17

In just over a week, we will begin the Lenten season. This is a season of prayer, contemplation, and seeking God. While the Lenten journey calls us to deny ourselves, pick up our cross, and follow Jesus – we are able to do so with the hope of Easter and what our resurrected Savior promises us. One of the promises is that we will become a new creation, the old will go and the new will come. I know that in my own life, I see so many areas where I long to grow and change. I would like to suggest that the path to this new life can happen as we choose to focus on three areas of change during the season of Lent.

First, be diligent in our <u>attitude</u> toward Christ. Scripture says that those who "seek" will find. (Mt 6:33) If we hunger and thirst for Christ more than desiring pleasure, money, or success we are promised that we shall indeed find Him. Second, be diligent in your <u>commitment</u> to Christ. Jesus calls us to be his disciples, and the life of any disciple requires commitment. During Lent, commit yourself to attending services regularly, or maybe join our mid-week (Wednesday) Bible study and prayer service, or perhaps serve the church by joining the choir, helping with the thrift store, or participating in our bimonthly prison ministry. Increase your level of commitment in some concrete way. Third, be diligent in renewing your <u>mind</u> to be like that of Christ. (Rom 12:1) Many people are fixed in their opinions and thoughts. But if God is truly going to change us from the inside out, we need a teachable spirit. This Lent, be open to the possibility that God wants to show you something new. Humble yourselves by having an open mind.

If we seek Christ with all our heart, if we commit ourselves to Him, and if we allow our minds to be teachable and moldable, I believe God will begin to bring about beautiful change in our lives. The old will begin to fade, and the new life that Christ promises of joy, peace, and love will flourish. May God be with you as we begin this journey toward becoming a new creation.

Join us for a **Pancake Dinner** on Shrove Tuesday, March 4, 2025, doors opening at 7:00pm benefiting the *Valley Stream Fire Department Burn Fund*. Shrove Tuesday is observed annually on the day before Ash Wednesday and is an opportunity for us to share with our congregation and community the beginning of our Lenten journey together. We will be serving all you can eat pancakes, sausage, coffee, and juice. Tickets will be available at the door, Adults \$20.00 and children under 12 are \$10.00.

Church School (2/23/2025). The Pharisees were very upset that Jesus was ministering to people they considered "sinners." The Pharisees saw themselves as righteous men, and they despised the sinners. They had concluded Jesus could not be from God because God did not like sinners either. Jesus responded to the unspoken question, "What is God's attitude towards sinners?" by telling a parable about the lost and found. A shepherd lost one of his one hundred sheep. He left the ninety-nine sheep to look for the one that was lost, because a sheep that strays away from the shepherd is in danger. The shepherd had compassion for his lost sheep. He didn't get angry or punish the sheep. Instead, he had great joy when he found the lost sheep. When he returned the sheep to the sheepfold, he called his neighbors and friends to come celebrate with him because the lost had been found. A woman had ten silver coins in a piece of jewelry traditionally worn by brides. When she lost one of the coins, she searched her house carefully to find the coin. When the coin was found, she called her neighbors and friends to come celebrate with her. The sheep and the coin both had great personal value. With the words of these stories, Jesus paints a beautiful picture of God's grace. Getting right to the answer of the question, Jesus says, "I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who changes both heart and life than over ninety-nine righteous people who have no need to change their hearts and lives...joy breaks out in the presence of God's angels over one sinner who changes both heart and life (Matthew 15:7, 10).




Ash Wednesday and Wednesday Evening Lenten Services.

We will have an Ash Wednesday service on March 5 at 8pm in the sanctuary. We will continue to offer Wednesday evening services for every Wednesday of Lent thereafter and leading up to Holy Week. Services will be an opportunity to draw closer to God during this Holy Season. Please join us for an intimate time of prayer and worship.

Spring 2025 marks the return of our beloved **Tenebrae Service** for the evening of Good Friday. The word "tenebrae" is Latin for "shadows" or "darkness," and the service is characterized by the gradual extinguishing of candles as readings and music reflect on the suffering and death of Jesus Christ. The service typically culminates in darkness and a loud noise, symbolizing the closing of Christ's tomb. It is a somber and reflective experience that helps to prepare Christians for the celebration of Easter. Volunteers are needed to participate in this service. No special talent is required, just a willingness to participate in this beautiful tradition.
