The Jean and Ken Larson Memorial Sunday was March 16th. The Emergency Food Program, sponsored by the Long Island Council of Churches, had its beginning here at Grace Church in 1976 under the direction of Jean and Ken Larson with two appeals made for food throughout the year. In 1977, Jean and Ken Larson initiated a program of contributions to be made weekly, 52 times a year, and it continues until today. In their honor and memory, we would ask you to bring extra food on any Sunday that you are able. There is a box labeled Jean and Ken Larson Memorial Sunday in the Narthex. Please continue to support this worthwhile tradition which has been going on for 49 years.

Church School (3/23/2025). The Passover meal was a family affair and a time of celebration of God's deliverance. Jesus chose to share the meal with his disciples. He sent them to prepare for the meal. The preparations included locating a place in Jerusalem to have the meal, removing items in the room containing yeast, obtaining a lamb and having it slaughtered by priests in the Temple, roasting the lamb, and preparing the meal. During the meal, Jesus announced his "hour" had come and indicated that one of his disciples would betray him. The disciples declared that they would never betray him. Judas asked, "Is it I, Rabbi?" Jesus knew his fate and the identity of his betrayer. He confirmed Judas as the betrayer, but the other disciples didn't understand. Jesus served the bread and the wine to his disciples. He told them, "Do this in remembrance of me." When we take Communion, we do it in remembrance of what Jesus did for all of us. Jesus' purpose, the forgiveness of all our sins, was accomplished by his death and resurrection. Jesus' sacrifice sealed the bond between God and people and established a new covenant. The Passover meal points to a memorial celebration of our deliverance through Jesus' death and life. Janet Stone

The service typically culminates in darkness and a loud noise, symbolizing the closing of Christ's tomb. It is a somber and reflective experience that helps to prepare Christians for the celebration of Easter. **Volunteers are needed to participate in this service.** No special talent is required, just a willingness to participate in

this beautiful tradition. If you have questions or wish to volunteer, please see Bob DiSalvo, Pastor Kim or anyone on the worship committee.
